

Jamborette Camping Guide



Campsite

Each district has been allocated an area based on their numbers. It is up to Districts on how they use the allocated area. A standard Jamboree campsite for a full unit of 36 scouts would be 600sq M or approximately 30m x 20m. Your District Leader will be responsible for the allocation of campsites within allocated area.

Arrival & Parking

A drop and kiss system will be in place for scouts arriving to efficiently move youth onto site and prevent traffic issues. Please ensure your parents are aware they will only have approximately 5 minutes to drop their scouts.

For leaders arriving that will be staying for the duration they will be able to move their vehicles onto the camping site. If you will be leaving the site during Jamborette you will need to park your car in the car park or designated area as advised by traffic control.

Vehicles are to be parked in a neat fashion, ideally along a boundary and not scattered throughout the scout campsite. There is to be no vehicle-based camping within the scout campsite area.

Any vehicle movements during jamborette will require a vehicle permit available from HQ for valid reasons.

Water

Unlike Cataract we will not have any provision for hose connection to campsites. Each unit will need to bring appropriate water drums and a cart to transport Water will be available to fill drums in the amenities area.

Grey water

Grey water is to be disposed of into the bush adjacent to the campsite. Please ensure food scraps are removed from grey water. Each unit will be provided with a strainer for this purpose. These strainers will be collected back from each Unit/District on Monday.

Garbage

Garbage will be collected from our Sites and Services team. Garbage must be in garbage bags, tied up and left just outside your Gateway for collection. **WE DO NOT HAVE THE SPACE TO REMOVE DAMAGED CAMPING EQUIPMENT; THIS MUST BE TAKEN HOME WITH YOU.**



Campfires

All campfires must be off the ground and measures taken to protect the grass. All firewood is to be brought to site. Under no circumstances is firewood to be collected from within the National Park. Coals (must be cold) from fires will be collected from Sites and Services on Monday. Please do not discard of these beforehand.

Trailer drop off

Trailers can be brought onto site after 2pm Friday. Leaders are permitted to erect their own personal tents however no scout tents or infrastructure such as dining fly's are to be erected. One of the key aims of Jamboree is to practice for Jamboree. Scouts will need to be proficient in setting up their own campsites and this is a great opportunity to practice. We are only 18 months out from the next Jamboree.

Activity set up

Activities can be set up from 2pm Friday. You will be able to move equipment onto your activity base on Saturday morning. Once activities open there are to be no vehicle movements. There are to be no car movements until after activities close on Monday.

Jamboree Pack Pick Up

On Friday night 1 leader from each unit will need to collect the jamboree pack for your unit. You will only be able to collect the pack for your unit.

Patrol Registration

On Saturday morning before lunch each patrol leader will need to attend HQ and register their patrol. When your patrols register they will be given a ticket to either the canoeing activity or the flying fox activity.
